Activity that occurred <u>after</u> Stop and Desist Orders were put into place by the county.

We as neighbouring landowners have had to spend time to attend, now three, hearings. We have watched, the comings and going of people to spend time on the property without benefit of obvious waste receptacles for trash, recycling or human waste, and all of this alongside our valued creek.

We have watched construction equipment arrive and, the subsequent assembly of a more sea cans-all without County Approval.

We have been told that this property was to be a hemp farm, a cannabis oil 'farm' and a refugee for Mongolian horses. We saw the property put up for sale and then taken off the market a short time later.
